Volunteer in Policing Service (VIP) Program

The Ellisville Police Department has joined thousands of law enforcement agencies around the country and internationally who use volunteers to supplement public safety and crime prevention efforts. The program helps police department personnel build stronger relationships within the community while allowing sworn police officers the ability to address crime more efficiently. Unfortunately, during the Pandemic the VIP program suffered several setbacks including the shelving of the majority of duties that the volunteers assisted with day-to-day. With the Pandemic in the rear view mirror and the opportunity to hit the ground running, we would like to bring the VIP program back with gusto! We are hoping in spring of 2023 to staff a strong volunteer group ready to hit the streets of Ellisville to assist the police department and the community! While we will be contacting and bringing back as many of the core group of volunteers as possible, we want to add as many new volunteers as possible to make the program as strong as it can be.

The VIP program will expand opportunities for qualified volunteers to assist the department in a wide range of roles and functions. Volunteers help fill critical gaps in program support and provide essential technical expertise. The program gives individuals the opportunity to give back to their community in a meaningful way and to support their local law enforcement agency whose members often wear “several hats” in their everyday work load. Our volunteers will be a “force multiplier” and will reach out to the community to give insight to the public on the police officers who work in their community,” says Chief of Police Steven Lewis.

The Ellisville Police Department VIP program will have a goal of fielding twelve volunteers. In the past, most volunteers consisted of retired citizens of the community who have been active in other volunteer adventures. Whether it is as simple as providing help in entering data, providing a presence in our senior living facilities, or as involved as conducting a radar survey, the VIPs will be able to assist the department in carrying out tasks, jobs, and public services that might not be in existence if it were not for the help of the VIP program. Pavilion Rentals

Pavilions in Bluebird Park are available to rent. Water and electric are turned on at the beginning of April and turned off at the end of October, weather permitting. Registration begins January 3, 2023 for Residents and January 17, 2023 for Non-residents.

Lions Pavilion - Accommodates approximately 100 people. Equipped with water, electric, 1 bbq grill and is located near the playground. \$60/day (\$40/day Resident)

Bussmann Pavilion - Accommodates approximately 125 people. Equipped with water, electric, and 2 bbq grills. \$60/day (\$40/day Resident)

Bluebird Pavilion - Accommodates approximately 10 people. Equipped with 1 bbq grill. \$40/day (\$30/day Resident)

Coupon Marketing Program

As part of the City's on-going efforts to help our businesses thrive, we are offering you the opportunity to introduce your business to every new resident by including a coupon or voucher in our New Resident Welcome Packets. The City of Ellisville provides every new household with a New Resident Welcome Packet. The Welcome Packet includes important information regarding City services, such as trash pick-up, recycling, leaf pick up, snow removal and many others.

How the Program Works

The City issues approximately ten (10) to forty (40) residential occupancy permits per month. That's ten to forty new households (and potential customers) every month! We ask that you provide the City with enough coupons/vouchers to insert in each Welcome Packet for three (3) months. There is no fee for the service. Your only expense will be the production of the actual coupons/ vouchers. Once you deliver the coupons/vouchers to City Hall, we will take care of the rest.

Coupons/vouchers that offer something free work best to get residents into your business. We ask that your coupon/voucher be sized 4" by 7" maximum. In addition to offering a 'freebie', we encourage you to add language in your coupon/ voucher 'Welcoming' the new residents to Ellisville and your business. Please include information regarding your hours of operation and services.

Coupons should be delivered to City Hall, 1 Weis Avenue, Ellisville, MO 63011 between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. Attention: Economic Development. Make sure all your business contact information is included.

Half Cent Sales Tax Storm Water Improvement Project Update



In 2022, the City of Ellisville completed asphalt street resurfacing projects on Marsh Avenue from Clarkson Road to Hutchinson Road, on East Meadow Lane from Manchester Road to Tulip Lane and on West Meadow Lane. The City also completed several concrete street replacement projects during 2022, which included Springbirch Court, Summer Oak Court, Summer Oak

Circle, Summer Oak Drive and the west section of Autumn Bluff Drive. A section of East Meadow Lane from Carole Lane to Tulip Lane and a section of Autumn Oaks Drive from Pierside Lane to Autumn Oaks Circle were also completely replaced in 2022.

For 2023, the City has several streets scheduled for complete concrete replacement. In the Oaks at Kiefer Creek Subdivision, the remaining section of Autumn Oaks Drive and Luger Wood Court are scheduled for complete replacement. In the Westridge Parc Subdivision, including Surrey Meadows Court, Westridge Parc Lane, the streets scheduled for complete replacement include the section of Barbara Ann Lane on the east side of Reinke Road and the section of Salem Way on the east side of Reinke Road. These projects are scheduled to begin in the summer and be completed in the fall.

In addition to these street replacement projects, the City will complete a project to construct a new sidewalk along the north side of Old State Road, between Pierside Lane and Ridge Road. This project will connect the existing sidewalk near Pierside to the Old State pedestrian crossing located just south of Ridge Road and is expected to be completed this fall.

The City will be contacting all residents impacted by these projects to discuss the proposed improvements and schedules for completion of the work.

These projects are being completed under the Half Cent Sales Storm Water Improvement Tax. The City of Ellisville would like to thank all of the residents impacted by the projects for their patience and cooperation during these improvements. Brush Chipping Program

Brush and tree trimming collections occur each spring and fall. Brush and tree trimmings are to be placed by the road no later than the Sunday night prior to your district's scheduled week for pickup. The Public Works crew will spend one week in the spring and two weeks in the fall in each district. Due to time constraints, they will not be able to return to a street after the brush pickup is completed. During the collection period you may call the public works department at (636) 591-6666 with any questions. Limbs should be cut in 4 to 12-foot lengths and must not be thicker than 4 inches in diameter. The following are some of the items that will not be chipped or picked up: trash, bushes with stumps, honeysuckle, bamboo, thorny material, leaves, grass, wood with nails or wire attached, trees with stumps, lumber, construction debris, dirt or rocks. These items could damage the processing equipment or injure an employee.

The City also received a grant from the St. Louis County Municipal Park Grant Commission for the renovation of Bobwhite Park, which is located off of Parkdale Circle, Salem Way and East Meadow in District I of Ellisville. A Park Master Plan was completed in 2022 with input from Ellisville residents through an on-line survey and two public meetings at the park. The renovation will include a new playground, improvements to the multi-purpose court, a shade shelter and some new walkways in the park.

The Ellisville Municipal Court has scheduled the 2023 court dates. Court will be held once a month on a Tuesday with the new time of 9:00 a.m. The Ellisville Municipal Court is a division of the 21st Circuit Court, and hears cases that are alleged violations of the Ellisville Municipal Ordinances. All cases are open to the public and viewable on Missouri's casenet, www.courts.mo.gov/casenet. Additionally, anyone is welcome to observe the court hearings in person.

Ellisville Updates Lighting Regulations to Increase Safety, Reduce Light Trespass and Glare

On November 16, 2022 the City Council approved changes to the zoning and sign codes. The intent of the changes is to decrease light pollution, eliminate glare, maintain property safety, preserve views of the night sky, promote energy efficiency, community health, and harmony between neighbors.



Did you see the intruder at the gate?

What are the Requirements?

A goal of the changes is to provide light that is closest to the natural light seen from the sun and stars. The light required is in the yellow color spectrum, which minimizes the use of light in the blue color spectrum. Great effort was made to make sure the rules are easy to interpret, easy to administer, and easy to enforce.

1. New and replacement outdoor light fixtures must be shielded so that the light shines downward — not upward which scatters light upward into the sky, nor directly sideways which results in horizontal glare that occurs when looking directly at a light bulb/lamp.
2. New and replacement outdoor light bulbs/lamps must feature a low Correlated Color Temperature (CCT), not to exceed 2700 Kelvin (K). CCT is essentially a gauge of how yellow (low CCT) or blue (high CCT) the color of the light emitted from a bulb/lamp appears.

ABOUT LIGHT COLOR

Light color is measured in CCT or "correlated color temperature." It is listed in degrees Kelvin but has nothing to do with the temperature of the bulb. It is the color that iron glows when heated to that temperature. Lower degrees Kelvin appears warmer and less blue.

These bulbs are all the same brightness. Warmer white is much easier to look at. The 2700K Warm White Bulb is good enough to see colors accurately.



How will the Ordinance be Enforced?

New developments will be required to provide an outdoor lighting plan that meets the requirements of the ordinance before construction and an as-built plan after construction to verify the light installation is compliant.

Residential property owners who change or replace their outdoor light fixtures or bulbs/lamps after the adoption of the ordinance will have to comply at the time the fixture or bulb is modified.
